Focus on God's Word

Every meal includes a "nugget from God's Word". Our staff (and even some campers) are given an opportunity to share what the Lord has taught them.

In a typical day a camper will read or hear the Word of God at two chapels, three meals, rest hour (Bible Memory Time), personal Bible Time each morning and cabin devotions each evening.

If a camper does not own a Bible (or forgot to bring one) a Bible is provided. Our prayer is that campers will develop a love for the Word of God and will continue daily Bible Reading at home.

2020 Summer Camp Fees

Summer Camp tuition alone does not meet all the expenses for the program. Income from events and guest groups provide for much of the monthly expenses and donations provide the income to maintain and update the buildings and equipment.

Considering the current economy, the board elected to freeze the summer camp tuition rates for this year. Summer camp tuition for 2020 remains at \$290.00 per week. This cost includes a t-shirt and cabin photograph. Waterskiing or Tubing remains at \$40 per week and transportation (South Florida: Hollywood & PGA Blvd) remains at \$40.

There are also discounts for families and groups. Camp provided scholarships, discounts and waivers totalling over twenty-nine thousand dollars in 2019. This was made possible by the generosity of our supporters.

Conrad and Rachel Campbell will be back with fun activities for couples. There is also a large block of totally free time to enjoy the camp facility and to be with one another.




CANOE TRIPS 2020

- Father-Son Canoe Trip: March 6-8, 2020
- Father-Daughter Canoe Trip: March 20-22, 2020

This is a wilderness overnight trip for dads (or a mentor) and children. On Friday, the group meets to assign duties and talk about the trip. Early Saturday, the group has breakfast and travels to the Ocklawaha River near Silver Springs. They camp overnight on the side of the river at a site permitted by Florida Greenways and Trails. They are picked up and returned to Camp Horizon on Sunday afternoon.

Camp provides transportation, meals, canoes and equipment. Families provide their own tent and bedding. We have a few loaner tents.



Camp Quilting Retreat

Focus on Meal Times

There have been multiple studies that support the importance of the family meal including a study published by the American College of Pediatricians on the benefits of the Family Table (May 2014).

For the week a child is at camp, their "family" includes counselors and campers that they share a cabin with. It is a time to talk and laugh. Yes, it gets noisy, but meal time is not just about food. It is about forming friendships and telling stories.

Not every camper benefits from a Family Table at home. Our prayer is that campers will ask their family to begin meals with Bible reading and prayer (like they do at camp) and will fill their mealtime with conversation and laughter.
